Public Assistance (PA) Program Application Checklist

Typical information required to complete the Public Assistance Program application process:

- Legal organization name. This is the legal name associated with your Federal Employer Identification Number (FEIN).
- Applicant's Agent. The person designated by the chief elected official to administer the grant for the organization.
- Mailing address for your organization and the Applicant's Agent, including the nine-digit zip code for both. The nine-digit zip codes can be looked up at https://tools.usps.com/go/ZipLookupAction!input.action.
- Email address. Your organization must have an email address that is checked regularly to apply
 for Public Assistance Program funding. Free email addresses are available from multiple sites
 online.
- Federal Employer Identification Number (FEIN). This is your organization's nine-digit tax identification number. Click here to request an FEIN if you organization doesn't have one https://irs.zoomfilings.com/?utm-source=irs.com&utm-medium=cpc&utm-term=slider%3Aget%20your%20ein%20tax%20id&utm-campaign=irs.com.
- Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) number. Click here to request a DUNS number. https://www.dandb.com/free-duns-number/.
- System for Award Management (SAM), Commercial and Government Entity (CAGE) code and Periodic Update Requirement Date (PURD). Log onto www.SAM.gov to obtain your CAGE code and PURD.
- Fiscal year start date (month and date). The month and day your organization's fiscal year starts annually.

The following forms must be completed to apply for Public Assistance Program funding:

- FEMA Form 90-49, Request for Public Assistance (RPA)
 - o In accordance with the FEMA policy memorandum dated September 17. 2019, each applicant must complete and submit their <u>FEMA Form 009-0-49</u>, <u>Request for Public</u> Assistance (RPA), using the PA Grants Portal (https://grantee.fema.gov). RPAs must be

submitted within 30 days from the declaration date or date a county is designated for Public Assistance. To request an invitation to register on the PA Grants Portal, applicants must contact the IEMA Public Assistance staff at (217) 782-8719 or PA grants@illinois.gov.

- IEMA Form PA101, Public Assistance Grant Agreement
- IEMA Form PA108, Public Assistance Risk Assessment
- IEMA Form PA109, FFATA Certification
- For Private Non-Profit (PNP) organizations, <u>FEMA Form 009-0-121</u>, <u>PNP Facility Questionnaire</u> for each facility.
 - o PNP organizations must also submit a copy of their charter or by-laws and have
 - o An effective ruling letter from the U.S. Internal Revenue Service granting tax exemption under Section 501(c), (d), or (e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, or
 - o State certification that the organization is a non-revenue producing non-profit entity organized or doing business under state law.
