- Motion to adopt the definition of access and functional needs support services, as recommended by the Executive Committee, as the Committee's standard and as the Committee's recommendation to IEMA to adopt as the agency standard for all doctrine.
 - Access and Functional Needs Support Services (AFNSS): The provision of services, devices and equipment that enable individuals with AFN to maintain their independence in a shelter, their home, camp, institution, or congregate care facility, including:
 - Reasonable modifications to policies, practices, and procedures of governmental and non-governmental entities to ensure equal accessibility and contextual accommodations.
 - Provision of communications services and assistive technology for individuals who are deaf, hard of hearing, blind, deaf/blind, have no or limited English proficiency, and/or other communication disabilities.
 - Provision of health maintenance services for individuals with chronic health conditions;
 - Provision of behavioral health services and supports for individuals with mental health and substance use conditions;
 - Provision of independence and assistive devices and equipment for individuals who utilize them to perform activities of daily living (ADLs) and instrumental activities of daily living (IADLs);
 - Provision of plain language print materials and resources;
 - Provision of support and safety services for individuals that are reliant on personal care assistance (PCA);
 - Provision of non-emergency transportation services to individuals who need access to a non-emergency medical transportation (NEMT) or medi-cars, and/or



- Accommodations for service animals.
- Motion to adopt the definition of older adult, as defined in state statute and recommended by the Executive Committee, as the Committee's standard and as the Committee's recommendation to IEMA to adopt as the agency standard for all doctrine.
 - Older Adult: A person of 55 years of age or older, or a person nearing the age
 of 55 for whom opportunities for employment and participation in
 community life are unavailable or severely limited and who, as a result
 thereof, has difficulty in maintaining self-sufficiency and contributing to the
 life of the community (Illinois Act on Aging, 20 ILCS 105/3.05).
- Motion to adopt the definition of at-risk individuals, as recommended by the Executive Committee, as the Committee's standard and as the Committee's recommendation to IEMA to adopt as the agency standard for all doctrine.
 - At-risk Individuals: Individuals with access and functional needs (AFN) and others who may need additional assistance before during and after a disaster, including but not limited to:
 - Children, including those unaccompanied by an adult;
 - Pregnant and lactating women;
 - Individuals with limited English proficiency (LEP);
 - Individuals with substance use disorders;
 - Individuals with limited access to transportation and or financial resources, including individuals experiencing homelessness;
 - Incarcerated individuals;
 - Individuals in institutional settings;
 - Individuals who require durable medical equipment, and/or
 - Individuals who need the delivery of personal care assistance (PCA) services and maintenance services.
