#### Welcome and Introductions

Introductions of new committee members, presenters, and guests.

Kenneth Jennings – Ken is the founder and CEO of the Gridiron Alliance Foundation,
a non-profit organization based in Illinois. He was injured in a high school football
game in 1988, which caused him to be paralyzed from the neck down. Ken helped to
get the "Rocky Clark" law passed in Illinois, which requires high schools in the state to
carry catastrophic injury insurance for student-athletes.



- Angela Botz Angela is a Community Outreach Coordinator for the IMPACT Center for Independent Living. She has previously served as the President of the Illinois Association of the Deaf and as a Chairperson for the St. Louis DEAFestival. She currently serves on several different committees involved in advocacy for the deaf, deafblind, and hard-of-hearing communities.
- **Todd Roach** Todd is the Human Resources Director for *The Marmon Group*, as well as an alderman for the City of O'Fallon. Todd has been diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis (MS) and is a member of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society.
- Randy Colón Randy is a research assistant for the ADA Participation Action
  Research Consortium (ADA PARC). He is currently pursuing a PhD in Disability Studies
  at the University of Illinois at Chicago and is working on a tool that will allow
  communities to assess whether people with disabilities are attaining affordable,
  accessible, and integrated housing. He is also legally blind.
- Dale Tieman Dale is the Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer at
  Peru Federal Savings Bank in La Salle, Illinois, where he also serves as the Assistant
  Fire Chief. He is currently a board member for multiple associations and foundations,
  including the Horizon House Foundation, a group that provides grants in support of
  the integration of people with disabilities in all areas of life.
- Allison Anderson, CEM Allison is the Director of the Will County Emergency
  Management Agency. She has over 13 years of experience in emergency
  management, including nearly 5 years of experience in the focus area of Public
  Health. As 1 of approximately 2,200 Certified Emergency Managers (CEMs) in the
  world, Allison brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to the committee.
- John Eckert John is the Deputy Division Manager for the Division of Planning,
  Research, Development, and Training at the Illinois Department on Aging, where he
  has worked for nearly 17 years. His primary focus is ensuring people with disabilities
  and the elderly have every opportunity to live independently. He has an M.A. in
  Rehabilitation Administration and Services from SIU-Carbondale.
- Judith Levitan Judith is the Chief of the Disability Right Bureau at the Illinois
   Attorney General's Office. She holds a bachelor's degree in Education of the Hearing
   Impaired, as well as a Juris Doctorate from Northwestern University and a Master of
   Laws in Child and Family Law from Loyola. In addition to this committee, Judith also
   serves on three other state committees related to access and functional needs.



• **Scott Gauvin** - Scott has nearly 19 years of emergency management experience and is the Manager of Strategic Operations and Preparedness (i.e., Chief Planner) for the Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA). In this role, he is charged with the strategic development of the Illinois Emergency Operations Plan (IEOP) and other hazard- and function-specific planning documents for the State of Illinois.

- Louise Conway (IEMA) Open meetings have set training that members are required to take in their first 30 days and annually thereafter, including ethics and harassment training.
